- 1. Insist on the strength of the Model:
 - ▶Standards
 - Accreditation and Training- quality assurance
 - New Clubhouse Development and Clubhouse Colleague Training

- Varied structures: Coalition Staff aspiration:
 Roles=
 - ► Government relations/funding-Financial viability is key and first!
 - ► Developing new and existing Clubhouses
 - ► Broader advocacy

3. Set Goals for:

- ▶ Define number of new Clubhouses
- ▶ Target a number of freestanding Clubhouses
- ► Aspire to be at least 50 ADA

- 4. Relationships with key stakeholders
 - ► Government Departments of Mental Health
 - ►NAMI (Family Advocacy)
 - State level organization for Local government/county entities
 - State level organization for Community Mental Health Centers

- Need leadership and delegation
- ► Keep the size of the group manageable
- ▶ Share and combine outcomes/ CPQ
- ▶ Network strategically with other states and countries
- ▶ Educate and make the case for each local area
- It is usually easier to start a new Clubhouse than to change an existing program

The Coalition assists Clubhouses in:

- ► Funding and Broader Advocacy
- ► Starting Clubhouses:
 - ◆Building a Board
 - Hiring staff
 - Obtaining employment
- ► Shared communications
- ▶ Collective research
